DAYLIGHT SAVINGS TIME: ends 2:00 AM on Sunday, November 1th. Please remember to turn your clocks back one hour before you go to bed on Saturday. Enjoy the extra hour!

THANKSGIVING: I want to wish you all a Happy Thanksgiving. It is hard to believe it is that time of year already. May we focus on the things that we have and be thankful for each and every day. May you all be able to spend more time with your family and friends. I appreciate being the Manager for Hawaiian Village. The office will be closed Monday through Friday, November 23 - 27th. We will re-open on Monday, November 30th at 9:00 AM. Here is an easy recipe that you may want to try. (It is a repeat, but a good one!)

EASY FALL APPLE CAKE:

1 Box yellow or spice cake mix (the mix only)

1 can (21 oz.) apple pie filling

4 eggs

Preheat oven to 350. Spray a 9 x 13 dish with cooking spray & set aside. Combine all the ingredients with a mixer until thoroughly combined. The mixer will help break up the apple pieces. Pour into prepared dish. Bake 35-40 minutes or until a toothpick inserted near the center tests clean. Allow cake to cool slightly before serving. Serve with sweetened whipped cream with a sprinkle of cinnamon if desired.

MEETING: Newby Management and the Association have met to discuss certain issues pertaining to the Community. We are working together to establish some additional improvements and compromises. Once such change is to provide one free FOB for each household. A replacement or additional FOB will be \$15.00. (See FOB'S Section)

FOB'S: An agreement was reached with the Association to provide one free FOB per household. There will be a \$15.00 charge for an additional FOB or a replacement FOB. The FOB's will open the Rec Hall, and soon the Club House and the Pool. If you paid for a FOB, you will receive a refund. The refund check will be available the week of November 9th.

MOTORCYCLES: Please be reminded that if you have a motorcycle, you must exit the Community via the shortest route in and out of the Community. Do not ride up and down the streets or play your music loud.

Please see Rules and Regulations D:16 on page 5 which states in part:

"No joyriding will be permitted within the Community by residents or guests. Community Management reserves the right to prohibit any motorcycle, moped and/or motor scooter from being stored, parked discretion and opinion, said vehicle are unreasonably loud and/or will disturb the health, safety, property, welfare or quiet enjoyment of community residents." We appreciate your cooperation.

WINDOWS & DOORS: The Club House is getting new windows and doors which will be installed within the next month. Once installed, the front door will have the same entrance system as the Rec Hall using the FOB system. The hours of operation will be from 6:00 AM until 9:00 PM, 7 days a week so that you can access the Library during those times or use the free WiFi.

SECURITY: If you see any unauthorized residents or someone that looks suspicious, please call 911 to report it during the day or night.

SHUFFLEBOARD: The equipment for shuffleboard is stored in the closet located near the Dog Park. The code for entering is 6103.

COUPON BOOKS: If you pay your lot rent by coupon, please note that new coupon books will be sent to you in December. If you would like to sign up for ACH so that your payment

is made automatically on the 3rd of the month, please see me.

NEW RESIDENTS: We have some new faces amongst us and we are so excited they are here and part of our community. Please make them feel welcome and introduce yourself. We welcome you all to Hawaiian Village and please let me know if you need assistance with anything. Please plan on attending the Saturday morning coffee to meet some of your neighbors.

<u>DIRECTORIES</u>: If you have not received a directory yet, please stop by the office to get one or see Anita Carney.

TRESPASING: Please do not walk in between or behind other homes in the community. Also, please do not ride your golf carts behind or between homes. This is an invasion of privacy.

SECURITY: Please be aware of scammers. Our community is a NO SOLICITING COMMUNITY and as such please be careful of those that try to come in soliciting business. Tell them to leave or call the office to report them.

- Check details of a contract before signing
- Consider installing motion detector lights and/or a camera
- Report suspicious activity or call

<u>PETS:</u> Please be mindful of the pet regulations which are stated in Section G:31 of the Rules and Regulations. This is also a respect issue. A portion which I have the most complaints on follows:

Pets must be restrained on a hand-held leash. Pets may not be "tied out" without proper supervision. Pets are not permitted on other residents' lots or on Common Ground at any time. Pets may be walked on the Community streets ONLY and residents

MUST pick up any droppings immediately and deposit them in their own trash receptacles upon returning home.
