Hello Residents,

I am so sorry for the troubles a lot of you are experiencing due to Hurricane Ian. However, I am so grateful that we didn't get the full force of it and now on to the repairs! Also, I can't tell you how much I appreciate the way so many of you have jumped in and helped your neighbors. We have such an awesome community and I care about you all so much. THANK YOU just seems inadequate, but its heartfelt!

You may have the FEMA info, but I wanted to provide you with it here. Also, Anita has put the FEMA Hotline phone number on the marquee. Recovery and cleanup will take time, so be patient with yourself and others and pace yourself.

FEMA HOTLINE: 800-621-3362 (7:00 am - 11:00 pm) Online at www.DisasterAssistance.gov. or you can go to the FEMA mobile app. You can now apply for assistance and when you do, you must have the following info available.

- A current phone number where you can be contacted
- Your address at the time of the disaster AND the address where you are now staying
- Your social security number
- A general list of damage and losses
- Banking info if you choose direct deposit
- If insured, the policy number or the agent and/or the company name

Survivors may be eligible to receive assistance for uninsured and underinsured damage and losses resulting from the Hurricane Ian. If you have homeowners, renters or flood insurance, you should file a claim as soon as possible. FEMA cannot duplicate benefits for losses covered by insurance. If your policy does not cover all your disaster expenses, you may be eligible for federal assistance.

Take photos to document damage and begin cleanup and repairs to prevent further damage. Remember to keep receipts from all purchases related to the cleanup and repair.

Disaster assistance may include financial help with temporary lodging and home repairs, as well as other disaster-related expenses.

GARBAGE, RECYCLING & YARD WASTE: Garbage pickup resumes normal schedule on October 3rd. Recycling is suspended until further notice. Properly prepared yard waste will be picked up as normal on Wednesday October 5th. Loose debris placed on the curb will be picked up by special trucks starting Friday, October 7th. The Lena landfill will be opened from 8AM until 6PM for residents at no charge. The annual one-time free pickup has been temporarily suspended.

GUEST PETS: This is a friendly reminder that guests who bring their pets must adhere to our community Rules and Regulations pertaining to pets. This applies to weight limit as well as keeping on a leash and picking up their pet waste. Our Rules and Regulations also apply to your guests' pets. Please contact me with any questions.

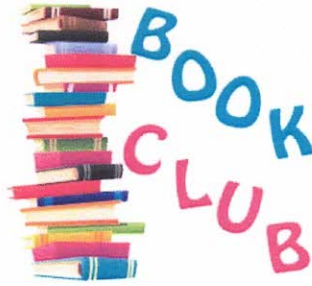
