
3 Ingredient Apple Spice Bread

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. In a mixing bowl, combine cake mix, diced apples and applesauce. Pour the apple batter into a nonstick bread pan. You can also line the bread pan with parchment paper if you are worried the batter will stick. Bake 40-45 minutes or until you can poke a toothpick into the center of the bread and it comes out dry. (Great as muffins as well, but adjust the baking time.)
